



WELFARE POLICY

At Soccer Elite FA we take our players welfare and safety extremely seriously. Soccer Elite FA is accredited by the Kent FA and so you can be assured:

- That all our coaches are appropriately qualified and hold relevant FA coaching awards, First Aid and Safeguarding qualifications
- That appropriate insurance policies are in place
- That we maintain best practice in business governance and financial management
- That we maintain safeguarding standards including DBS (previously CRC) checks for all coaches undertaking regulated activities
- That we demonstrate our understanding of and commitment to inclusion and equality in our practice
- That none of our employees are currently banned or suspended by the Football Association or County FAs.

We are committed to the FA's Respect campaign, believing that players, coaches and match officials should enjoy the game without being subjected to criticism, abuse or disruption.

Our Codes of Conduct for players, coaches and spectators set out the standards of behaviour that we expect at Soccer Elite FA. Any breach of the codes will be reviewed by the Directors and may result in a warning, suspension or exclusion.

BULLYING

Bullying of any kind is unacceptable at Soccer Elite FA. If bullying does occur, players or their parents should tell us about the incident(s) so we can deal with the matter promptly and effectively.
